**** All Range Cards Have Been Issued ****

All members with Chapter range privileges had a Range Card mailed to the address indicated on their renewal. Beginning March 1, Range Cards will be mandatory and must be prominently displayed at all times while using any chapter range. 2017 Chapter Membership Cards indicating range status will no longer be accepted as valid identification for range use as of March 1.

Range Cards (continued)

Per the October 3, 2017 Range Rules (available at www.iwlar.org, click on Forms and Documents), three types of Range Cards were issued:

<u>Archery Approved</u>: may use the Archery range unsupervised

Range Approved: has the privileges of Archery Approved and additionally may use the Rifle and Pistol ranges under the supervision of a Duty Range Officer

Range Officer: has the privileges of Archery Approved and Range Approved and additionally may use the Rifle and Pistol ranges unsupervised

If you have Chapter range privileges but have not received a Range Card, please contact Mike Wang immediately.

Duty Range Officers are reminded that Chapter Membership Cards no longer display range status and Range Cards are the acceptable form of identification for Chapter ranges. The *only exception* is for new members displaying a *Temporary Chapter Membership Card* with Archery or Range Approved stamped on the card while awaiting receipt of their Range Card. Distribution normally takes 30 days as member numbers must be received from national IWLA before Range Cards can be generated.

March 10 Range Officer Training Class

Space remains in the Range Officer Training Class scheduled for Saturday, March 10, to train new range officers and re-certify existing RO's. The class runs from 9:00 AM - 3:30 PM with lunch provided.

For new Range Officers, class prerequisites are that you must be Range Approved for at least six months, have a Range Officer Certification Card signed by three Duty Range Officers while using the pistol range on separate occasions before the class, and successfully complete a test on the Range Rules prior to the class. **Upon class completion, new Range Officer candidates must successfully serve as the Duty Range Officer during the live fire portion of a Range Orientation Practical Training Class for new members held each month to receive their Range Officer credentials.**

Range Officers are granted the privilege of using the rifle and pistol ranges when a Duty Range Officer is not present on weekends. With the privilege of greater range access comes a responsibility – you must serve as a Duty Range Officer approximately twice each year.
