good standing. Members can register their children ages 8-18 and member adults. Non-member registration opens April 1 and is only available for children 8-18. The program runs on Sundays from June 2-August 4. All equipment is provided.

Wood Duck Wrap Up

Just a few weeks ago Team Wood Duck* wrapped up our annual winter work days on the Chapter's nest boxes. Unfortunately, due to extremely high water levels in the McKee-Beshers Wildlife Management Area where most of the boxes are located, we were not able to reach a number of them. (The water situation, we learned, wasn't due solely to high winter precipitation but to some very busy dam-building beavers as well.)

Some numbers:

- + Ducks nested in 52% of boxes last spring, below the average 60-65%
- + Volunteers counted evidence (membranes) of 35 hatchlings but doubtless a bunch more hatched.
- + Best number of all: 18. That's the total of Ikes who pitched in this winter half a dozen who came out for most or all four workdays as well as some first-timers who are now hooked!

All of this means we are ready for spring nesting; just in time, too, with the ducks arriving from the south in the next few weeks. And whether you could participate or not this winter, I believe we've got us a program in which every Chapter member can take a lot of pride.
