Clopper Mill Cleanup

On April 18 we will host a clean-up at the old Clopper Mill ruin in Seneca Creek State Park. You can see the brick walls still standing right along Clopper Road (just below Waring Station) but it's very hard to reach from within the State Park, making a much-needed clean-up difficult.

For the April 3rd General Membership Meeting, Sam Droege, of the USGS Patuxent Wildlife Research Center to be our Guest Speaker for the evening. Sam is a Wildlife Biologist and hunts wild bee species in the state of Maryland as part of his position in managing the USGS BMIL – Bee Management and Inventory Laboratory. These are NOT HONEY BEES! But you will find his presentation to be totally fascinating.



Sam has been spent most of his career at the USGS Patuxent Wildlife Research Center. He has coordinated the North American Breeding Bird Survey Program, developed the North American Amphibian Monitoring Program, the BioBlitz, Cricket Crawl, and FrogwatchUSA programs and worked on the design and evaluation of monitoring programs. Currently he is developing an inventory and monitoring program for native bees, online identification guides for North American bees at www.discoverlife.org, and with Jessica Zelt reviving the North American Bird Phenology Program. Muzzleloader and Rifle Leagues begin in April

The Muzzleloader League will start on Wednesday, April 1st. Matches are held on the first Wednesday of each month, through October, at the pistol range. Arrive anytime starting at 4:30 pm up until about one hour before dusk. Arriving earlier is better, especially if it's your first time or if you want to shoot multiple times. Chapter membership is not required. If you don't have the required equipment, let us know, in advance, and we will supply it, with instruction.

The Rifle League will start on Wednesday, April 8th. Matches are held on the second Wednesday of each month, through October, at the pistol range. Arrive anytime starting at 4:30 pm up until about one hour before dusk. Chapter membership is not required. If you are a new shooter, we have all the equipment and ammo for the Introductory category, just show up.

Eye and ear protection are required. Cost is \$2 per relay for targets, awards, etc. You must shoot in a minimum of three matches in a category to qualify for an end-of-season award and for awards to be given there must be at least two qualifying shooters in that category. Match results will be published.

All shots (except sighting shots) must be held off-hand (no external support). NRA Pistol Rules apply when not superseded by this document, i.e., no wrist or elbow support, no gloves, no special jackets, etc. Slings are allowed.

Shooters under 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent at each match and the parent must annually sign a liability waiver. Any questions, contact Susan Cassell

IWLA at the 2020 Montgomery County Fair

Each year the Rockville Chapter provides the tent, booth and set-up at the County Fair. Chapters and volunteers from the county provide information about IWLA at all levels. Wood duck progress report

During January, 18 volunteers checked 58 wood duck nesting boxes at 4 sites in McKee-Beshers. 58% of the boxes were used for nesting during the spring of 2019 with 142 membranes recorded. 16 boxes were inaccessible or down. In 2019, 8 bluebird boxes were installed on the backs of the wood duck boxes to try to prevent the prothonotary warbler from nesting in the wood duck boxes. All 8 bluebird boxes has nests. 2 of the 8 associated wood duck boxes had pecked eggs. All this information was documented and communicated to Maryland DNR. ~*Ryck Ledecker*~
