## May Speaker Spotlight

Jennifer (Jenny) St. John is the Senior Water Quality Specialist for Montgomery County DEP. She leads the County's stream monitoring team to monitor aquatic biology, stream habitat, physical geometry, and chemistry at stream sites. These data are used to assess health of County sub watersheds over time, evaluate success of watershed restoration projects and measure impacts of development.



## IWLA at the Montgomery County Fair

Each year the Rockville Chapter provides the tent at the County Fair. Volunteers from the Chapters in Montgomery County provide information about their chapters as well as the State and National IWLA organization to those attending the County Fair. This year the fair starts on the 10th of August and runs through 18th. Volunteers are needed to help at our booth from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. or from 4 p.m. to 10 p.m. Tickets and parking are provided to volunteers. An introductory kayak class is scheduled for June 2 rain or shine from 10 AM to 2 PM at our Chapter House and lake. All kayak equipment will be provided. This class is for those who have never kayaked and those with limited experience and will cover safety, parts of a kayak, entry and exit, strokes and more. ### **Muzzleloader League**

The Muzzleloader League started on Wednesday, April 4th. Matches are held on the first Wednesday of each month, through October, at the pistol range. Arrive anytime starting at 4:30 pm up until about one hour before dusk. Arriving earlier is better, especially if it's your first time or if you want to shoot multiple times. Chapter membership is not required. If you don't have the required equipment, let us know, in advance, and we will supply it, with instruction.

Eye and ear protection are required. Cost is \$2.00 per relay for targets, awards, etc. You must shoot in a minimum of three matches in a category to qualify for an end-of-season award and for awards to be given there must be at least two qualifying shooters in that category. Averages will be kept to three decimal places. Match results will be published.

All shots (except sighting shots) must be held off-hand (no external support). NRA Pistol Rules apply when not superseded by this document, i.e., no wrist or elbow support, no gloves, no special jackets, etc. Slings are allowed.

There are no age limitations, but absolute safety is required. Shooters under 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent at each match and the parent must annually sign a liability waiver.

### **Rifle League**

The Rifle League began on Wednesday, April 11th. Matches are held on the second Wednesday of each month, through October, at the pistol range. Arrive anytime starting at 4:30 pm up until about one hour before dusk. Chapter membership is not required. If you are a new shooter, we have all the equipment and ammo for the Introductory category, just show up.

Eye and ear protection are required. Cost is \$2.00 per relay (Introductory category is free). You must shoot in a minimum of three matches in a category to qualify for an end-of-season award and for awards to be given there must be at least two qualifying shooters in that category. Averages will be kept to three decimal places. Match results will be published.

All shots (except sighting shots) must be held off-hand (no external support). NRA Pistol Rules apply when not superseded by this document, i.e., no wrist or elbow support, no gloves, no special jackets, etc. Slings are allowed.

There are no age limitations, but absolute safety is required. Shooters under 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent at each match and the parent must annually sign a liability waiver.

## You would Bee Surprised

March 29<sup>th</sup> was a nice warm day – ideal for installing packages of bees. Each package weighs about 3 pounds and contains over 10,000 bees. Each comes with a can of sugar water to feed them during their trip from Georgia. It also contains a small cage with a queen. After carefully hanging the queen cage between two frames, the next step is to simply dump the bees into the hive. They quickly make their way down between the frames.

Three days later we checked the queen to make certain she escaped her cage – if not, we would have released her into the hive. Now it's up to her to get acclimated and begin laying 1,500 to 2,000 eggs a day, over 1,000,000 in her lifetime. A bee fact: All the bees you see pollinating flowers are females. Norma Kawecki, Ellison Withers and Lee Hays will keep a close eye on our five hives in the apiary. Visitors are welcomed.
