## Mini Crisis at the Lake after record rainfall

A crisis at the lake was quickly avoided with the quick action of four dedicated members! After extremely heavy rainfall on Saturday, July 21<sup>st</sup>, the streams and tributary's around the IWLR Lake were flowing over capacity. The IWLR lake feeder stream was discovered to be blocked by forest debris and if not removed the waterflow could have easily taken out the gravel road that goes over the culvert that feeds into the chapter lake. Luckily a team of IKES literally jumped in and tackled the problem immediately.



Jay Copsey volunteered to climb into the overflowing feeder stream where the water was chest high and began clearing the culvert opening with the help of Tom Vegella, Bill Jackson and Bill Leaman. The team was able to remove most of the debris with the exception of a large fallen tree trunk.



With Bill Leaman at the tractor's wheel, the team secured a chain around tree trunk and successfully pulled it out of the feeder stream unclogging the culvert and reestablished the water flow. With the tree trunk and debris removed, the stream should flow as intended keeping the road around the lake intact.

## **Ranges Short Shots**

### **August Pellet Gun Shoots**

As announced in the June 2018 newsletter, Sunday morning pellet gun shoots will be held on designated Sundays from 10:00 AM - 12:30 PM at the Pistol Range as Chapter sanctioned events. Two shoots are scheduled for August: Sunday, August 19 and Sunday, August 26. Both events will begin at 10:00 AM and conclude by 12:30 PM. The below procedures apply:

- .177 or .22 caliber lead pellets only (no BB's)
- Eye protection required; ear protection optional
- Permissible targets include paper on existing target backings and positions or paper, empty aluminum cans, or empty plastic bottles suspended from a Field Target Holder
- All targets will be properly recycled or removed from Chapter property

### **Pruning and Trimming Needed Around the Rifle and Pistol Ranges Perimeter**

The fence that encloses the rifle and pistol range impact areas has a walking path on the outside to facilitate fence maintenance. Trimming and pruning is needed once each year to maintain the walking path in traversable condition. A volunteer is needed to perform the pruning and trimming. This job is an excellent venue for meeting your six-hour annual chapter service requirement. A gas trimmer, medium sized pruning shears, work gloves, and 4 - 6 hours is needed to accomplish this task. Contact Duval Crist for further details.

### **September 15 Range Officer Training Class**

Space remains in the Range Officer Training Class scheduled for Saturday, September 15 to train new range officers and re-certify existing RO's. The class runs from 9:00 AM - 3:30 PM with lunch provided.

For new Range Officers, class prerequisites are that you must be Range Approved for at least six months; have a Range Officer Certification Card signed by three Duty Range Officers while using the pistol range on separate occasions before the class; and successfully complete a test on the Range Rules prior to the class. Upon class completion, new Range Officer candidates must also successfully serve as the Duty Range Officer during the live fire portion of a Range Orientation Practical Training Class for new members held each month to receive their Range Officer credentials.

Range Officers are granted the privilege of using the rifle and pistol ranges when a Duty Range Officer is not present on weekends. With the privilege of greater range access comes a responsibility – you must serve as a Duty Range Officer approximately twice each year.

## New email distribution list

At our June Board meeting, the Board of Directors heard complaints of unreliable email distribution with our existing Yahoo “IWLAR” and “IWLAR-Board” email lists. As a result, email addresses of all current members and non-members from our Yahoo group have been loaded into a new Google group. Users have the option to remove their email address from the distribution list but we are hopeful that you would not do this because you will miss event announcements, work parties, and other similar chapter correspondence. If you are receiving duplicate email notices, then you may have submitted a different email address when you renewed your membership than you were using on Yahoo. Remove the address that you do not want to use. If you are not receiving email from the distribution list, then there are four possible causes:

- You did not submit an email address when you renewed membership,
- The email message you submitted or on record was not valid,
- You made an election on Google to not permit your email address to be used on Google distribution lists, or
- Your email messages are “bouncing” (we will attempt to resolve these with you if you are a current member).
