October 9 Range Officer Training Class

Spaces remain in the Range Officer Training Class scheduled for Saturday, October 9, to train new range officers and re-certify existing RO's. The class will run from 9:00 AM - 3:30 PM with lunch provided.

For new Range Officers, class prerequisites are that you must be Range Approved for at least six months, have a Range Officer Certification Card signed by three Duty Range Officers while using the pistol range on separate occasions before the class, and successfully complete a test on the Range Rules prior to the class.

Range Officer qualified members are granted the privilege of using the rifle and pistol ranges when a Duty Range Officer is not present on weekends. With the privilege of greater range access comes a responsibility – you must serve as a Duty Range Officer approximately twice each year.

Jr. Air Rifle and Jr. BB Gun training starts in Sept.

The Jr. BB gun class is open to children ages 8 - 15. It meets most Tuesday evenings from 7 - 9 pm and continues until May. The orientation for BB gun will be Tuesday, Sept. 28 at 7:00 pm. Parents should plan to attend the first meeting. The fee is \$45 for members and \$50 for non-members.

The Jr. Air Rifle class is open to children ages 12 - 18. It meets most Saturday mornings from 9 - 11 am and continues until May. The orientation will be Saturday, Sept. 18^{th} at 9 am. The fee for member is \$50 and for non-member is \$55.

For both classes, the Chapter provides all the equipment. Students need only bring eye protection (ear protection optional)
