<u>Air Pistol Kicks Off</u>

The air pistol league will begin Tuesday, October 9th. The upstairs of the Chapter House will be available for shooting from 4:00 - 7:00 pm. You can arrive any time between 4:00 - 6:30 pm. It takes about 35 - 45 min. to shoot (if there is an open position) and another 10 min. for scoring. We shoot a 30 shot slow fire match, with 10 optional sighters. All scoring and socializing will be on the lower level. Please enter at the lower level. The league runs for 23 weeks. Come as often or little as you want. You must attend at least 8 matches to be eligible for an award. The cost for the season is \$20 for Chapter members and \$25 for non-members. New shooters are welcome to come to any match to try it out. We have air pistols for use. This is a handicap league based on how well you shoot against your average, so come on out and try it!
