New IWLAR Range Officer Assignment Procedures

IWLAR is very lucky to not only have well maintained Pistol and Rifle Ranges, but also to have a cadre of dedicated Range Officers who help keep our ranges safe and well-staffed.

Over the past year we have transitioned from sending out our Duty Range Officer (DRO) assignment letter from USPS (snail mail) to exclusively email. This process is more effective and saves the Chapter printing and mailing costs and volunteer time.

We have also set up a Range Officer (RO) Google Group, managed by both Duval Crist, our Range Coordinator, and David Schwartzman, our RO Scheduler. Membership in the RO Google Group is a requirement for all ROs. This gives both the Range Safety Committee and the ROs the ability to efficiently communicate as a group about requests to swap DRO dates and other operational range issues.

David Schwartzman sends duty assignments to individual ROs at the end of each month and then sends a RO Google Group message to all ROs with the 2-month schedule and current DRO roster at the beginning of the month.

We have updated our DRO assignment letter in the email to include two reply options that DROs need to promptly forward to the RO Scheduler email address at roscheduling@iwlar.org. This allows David to know that both DROs received their assignment letter and whether they can serve on the assigned date. The email reply options to the DRO assignment letter are either:

I will serve as a DRO on the designated day and time.

OR,

I cannot serve as a DRO on the designated day, but I will find a substitute RO and e-mail their name, e-mail, and phone number to you as soon as possible.

We are reminding our ROs that they are required to email one of the two replies ASAP.

Also, we are asking our ROs to let us know if they have not been receiving the RO Google Group messages and if they have changed their preferred email address and/or cell phone number. ROs may send an email message to roscheduling@iwlar.org with updated contact information.

Air Pistol League begins October 5th

The air pistol league will begin Tuesday, October 5th. We will continue with the @Home and @Chapter options. Shoot at home and email/text me the targets each week or shoot at the Chapter. The upstairs of the clubhouse will be available for shooting each Tuesday from 3:30 - 7:00 pm. You can arrive any time between 3:30 - 6:30 pm. It takes about 30 - 40 min. to shoot and another 10 min. for scoring. We shoot a 30 shot slow fire match, with 10 optional sighters. All scoring and socializing will be on the lower level. Please enter at the lower level. The league runs for 23 weeks. Come as often or little as you want. You must attend at least 8 matches to be eligible for an award. The cost for the season is \$20 for members and \$25 for nonmembers. New shooters are welcome to come to any match to try it out. We have Chapter air pistols for use and .177 wadcutter pellets. This is a handicap league based on how well you shoot against your average, so come on out and try it! Please bring eye protection. Any questions call Susan Cassell.
